CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Health System has entered into an exclusive partnership for anesthesia services with STAR Anesthesia, a physicianowned and operated medical group providing anesthesia services throughout San Antonio, Houston, and parts of Texas for more than 30 years. Comprised of more than 200 providers, they offer anesthesia services across the full spectrum of specialty needs and require all of their anesthesiologists to be ACLS trained and board certified/board eligible.

The partnership is effective May 1 in the adult facilities and May 29 at The Children's Hospital of San Antonio (CH of SA). This partnership with STAR Anesthesia will help provide high-quality, compassionate care to our patients and support to our surgeons.

CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Hospital – Alamo Heights, Obstetric services at CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Hospital - New Braunfels, Cardiac surgery at CH of SA, and CHRISTUS Santa Rosa Physician Ambulatory Surgery Centers will not be included in this partnership.

Log in, but log OFF!

Our tech folks are discovering some breaches in security because Associates and clinicians are not properly signing off from workstations when they are done accessing information. Merely closing out sessions and applications isn't enough: your credentials may still be active in Meditech and other programs, leading to errors when the next computer user begins working on the same device.






